The finals for the Open, Women's, Seniors' and Juniors' Standardplay Championships will be held at venues in Hull and Milton Keynes in early October, subject to Covid 19 restrictions in place at the time. Hull will host the Main Championships and the Women's Championship and Milton Keynes will host the Junior and Senior Championships.

Eligibility

Championship events are open only to British Isles Citizens, British Overseas Territories Citizens, or players resident therein for the past year, or those with British Overseas Dependent Territories Citizenship.

Junior Championships

In Junior Championships, ages relate to 1st January 2021 e.g. an Under 10 will be born in 2011 or later. In all Junior Championships the highest placed boy and highest placed girl in each section will receive a trophy.

The FIDE Laws of Chess apply throughout the Championships, except where specifically amended in the tournament rules. These can be found at https://www.britishchesschampionships.co.uk

Qualification Rules

CHAMPIONSHIP 2nd - 10th October 2021

GMs, WGMs, IMs and WIMs are eligible to play in this event together with those who qualified for the BOCC-2 Open Standardplay Championship Final in July/August 2021

WOMEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP 14th - 17th October 2021

WGM's and WIM's are eligible to play in this event together with those who qualified for the BOCC-2 Women's Standardplay Championship Final in July/August 2021

JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS (Under 18, 16, 14, 12, 10, 8) 2nd and 3rd October 2021

Players who qualified for the BOCC-2 Online Junior Standardplay or Rapidplay finals held in July and August are invited to take part in the Junior finals in the same age group for which they qualified.

SENIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS 4th - 10th October 2021

These Championship events will be open to all players as follows -

Over 50 – born 1971 or earlier

Over 65 - born 1956 or earlier

- subject to the eligibility rules.

All qualifiers will be contacted as soon as possible after the Online Championships to confirm details. In addition, there will be a number of direct entries for titled players. Each National Association (England, Scotland, Wales, Ireland, Ulster, Jersey, Guernsey, Isle of Mann) will also be given one nomination into each of Championship and Women's Championship. The organisers also reserve the right to offer wild cards into the Championship or Women's Championship.

Play will take place in the hotel (Milton Keynes) and the conference centre (Hull) with accommodation available at the venues.

Rates of Play

Ratings

For all sections in all tournaments the ratings used for each tournament will be in the following order of priority ---

FIDE OTB Rating (September 2021)

ECF / National OTB Rating (September 2021)

ECF / National Online Rating (September 2021)

1) Where a player has none of the above, the organisers will assign an estimate based on all available data on a case-by-case basis, failing which the player will be assigned a rating of 0

2) The ratings allocated by this process will be used in the calculation of any relevant prizes.

Obtaining a FIDE Identification Number

All entrants playing in a FIDE-rated section must have a FIDE ID number AT THE TIME OF SUBMITTING THEIR ENTRY, unless they wish their FIDE nationality to be England. English players without a FIDE ID number will have one created at the time the rating files are submitted to FIDE.

Overlapping events

Players may not take part in two tournaments on the same day if the sessions are scheduled at the same time.

Byes

The preferred way for byes to be claimed is on the entry form where at all possible. Players may take up to 2 half-point byes in any section. A player will score 0 if a half-point bye is taken in the last round. If a player takes two byes then they will score 0 if the second half-point bye is taken in the last round, or if both the half-point byes are taken in the last two rounds.

Tie Breaks

Where there is a tie for 1st place, the following tie-breaks will be used, except in the case of the British Championship (see regulations) –

(1) Direct Encounter (2) Median-Buchholz (3) Buchholz Cut 1 (4) Buchholz To qualify for the English Championship prize players must be FIDE-registered to ENG.

Publicity

Please note that video and photographs will be taken at the event which may be used for publicity purposes both for the current Championships and those in future years. Any objection by an individual to streaming, video or photography as above should be notified to the event organisers. Information on how we use the data you provide us is included in the 'Conditions 2019' section which can be accessed on this website (a paper copy of which is available on request via the ECF Office), as is other information for competitors, including conditions of entry and tournament rules. Entry to the Championships is deemed to be acceptance of the conditions shown on this site.

English players MUST be members of the English Chess Federation. Gold membership is required for all events. Members should quote their membership number on the entry form. Other players MUST be a member of their national body.

To avoid late fees, both the entry form and entry fee MUST BE RECEIVED before the 'late fee' date of 24/09/2021.

Venue and Accommodation Hull (Open and Women's Championships)



The playing venue is the Canham Turner Conference Centre, University of Hull, Cottingham Road, Hull, HU6 7RX - https://www.beyond-events.co.uk/venues/canham-turner/. The Canham Turner is a modern conference facility, benefiting from a recent £7m upgrade and circled in red on the campus plan.



We can offer participants free onsite parking permits on request.

Travelling to the event

Hull is easily accessible by public transport or road. It's just two and a half hours drive from major cities like Newcastle and Birmingham. Manchester is less than two hours away, and you can drive to Leeds or Sheffield in just over an hour. The postcode for the campus entrance is HU6 7RU.

The University is between two and three miles from Hull Paragon (Central) station and can be easily reached by bus (12/14 minutes). During the day there are three buses an hour, two an hour in the evening. Routes 103, 105, x47. Buses run until around 23.30.

There are cafes and bars on site and a large pub just outside the University entrance. Ten minutes' walk away, Newlands Avenue has a number of bars, cafes and restaurants. For those not wishing to stay at the University there are hotels close to Hull Paragon Station and the City Centre.

Accommodation

There are (limited) single bedrooms available on campus at £39.00 per night bed and breakfast and some doubles at £61.00 per night at two university-controlled B&B's near to the site. These may be booked direct here - https://www.beyond-

There are also a small number of rooms available on site which may be reserved by contacting Stephen Greep at sjgreep@gmail.com on a first come, first served basis). Parking permits are also available adjacent to the playing venue and will again be allocated on a first come, first served basis (also by contacting Stephen Greep).

For those not wishing to stay at the University there are hotels close to Hull Paragon Station and the City Centre.

Travelling to the Event

Kents Hill Park is easily accessible by road or rail, with 450 free parking spaces on site. M1 junctions 13 and 14 are both provide easy access from the North, South and East. The A421 runs along the north boundary of Kents Hill providing access from the West.

Taxis are always outside the MK Central Station or Bletchley station and both journeys will take just 10 minutes to Kents Hill Park Training and Conference Centre.

There is a restaurant and bar on site. Kingston Centre is about 10 minutes walk away along the Redways, with a pub and several places to buy meals and food to take away, including Nando's and McDonalds. Also clothing and chemist shops, in case of emergencies. There are more restaurants in Central Milton Keynes and surrounding villages which can be reached in less than half an hour driving. For those without transport, there are several pubs within walking distance that do food.
